The extended abstract, with 2.5 cm (one-inch) margins on all four sides, in 12 point black Times New Roman, justified, begins on the third line after the addresses and continues for up to three pages of text, figures and references. It will be collated and printed as a letter-size document in the Program/Abstract Book; a PDF version will be available on the conference web site.

There is one line between paragraphs; references are indicated as shown here [1], listed in numerical order at the end of the extended abstract. The extended abstract continues, etc. but please ignore the rest of this paragraph. It was written purely to take up space and provide a visual indication of what a realistic length paragraph looks like. In another couple of lines we will start a new paragraph or, in fact, probably just repeat the present one but with a couple of minor changes so that it is a little longer or shorter. It is simply a question of aesthetics now, so we may as well simply repeat the text after some information about graphics/figures.

Feel free to insert graphics/figures in your extended abstract but please make sure they will remain the correct size and and in the correct position in the final document. The Program/Abstract Book will be printed in black and white but the graphics/figures will retain any colour in the .pdf files on the web site. And now here we go with repetition. There is still one line between paragraphs and this should be the case right up until the end of the extended abstract. Of course, further references are also indicated as shown here [2], listed in numerical order at the end of the extended abstract. The extended abstract continues, etc. up to a total of three pages including title, authors and author information, text, graphics/figures and references.
